

Have you heard about **Expanded Access** to school-based health services?

Expanded Access allows school districts to enroll as Medicaid providers and bill for services provided to Medicaid-enrolled students.

- Students do not need an individualized education program (IEP)
- Health services provided under Expanded Access do not negatively affect other Medicaid services given outside of the school environment.
- School districts have often provided these services for years without reimbursement.

Examples of covered services include:

- Preventative health exams
- Behavioral and mental therapies
- · Speech, occupational, and physical therapies

Some benefits of providing health services in the school setting include:

- Schools can provide needed behavioral health and medical services without the student leaving school!
- Student concentration improves!
- Attendance increases and behavior problems are reduced!
